### October Program

The October Program will feature one of the furniture and decorative arts curators from the Birmingham Museum of Art. We will discuss design characteristics of period furniture styles.

Additionally, the presentation will include a discussion of a wonderful visiting display of furniture and decorative arts currently on exhibition at the museum. This display spans 700 years (there is a 13th

century "blanket chest" and pieces as recent as 1999). Please come and bring a friend!

Note: Starting with the October program we will be changing our format. The program will begin at 9 AM. After the presentation, we will take a break and then have our business meeting.

Starting with the new year, we plan to have a woodworking demonstration each month after the business meeting as time permits.

### **September Meeting**

Our visitor, Joel Battle of Pinson, choose a good meeting to visit. There were design discussions regarding the platform being built for Children's Hospital (page3) and talk of our annual juried show.

Jim Anchors asked for and got volunteers to make flag cases for 10 families from the September 11th tragedy. Hardwoods of Alabama , Lowes, and some glass companies have made contributions of materials. Dan Browning and Harold Hall have volunteered to put a lacquer finish on the boxes when they are complete.

Dan Browning gave us a demo of the Hi Purformer glue by Titebond. After the demo was Show and Tell. Marty Cogen brought a cherry nightstand he had just made giving credit to Hal Skalka, Jim Lee, Dan Browning, and Paul Mancill for being his mentors. Jim Phillips brought a trophy base he had made for a Patriot statue destined for a Rose Bowl Parade official. Buzz and Nelda Kelly brought a cherry box they had made and George Schoppert brought a toy school bus.

Then Denis Hermecz brought us a slide presentation of his works. He has made some incredible cabinetry. He has combined his traditional skills very well with his artistic talents to create unique custom cabinetry for his clients. Denis told us that "people are hungry to hear what a woodworker says about how to use wood."

After the meeting, our shop visit was at the shop of **Paul Mancill**. Thanks to **Paul** for having us all over to his shop. It was a pleasure to check out **Paul**'s shop and see all that wood.


- October 18

Follow Chalkville Mtn Road approximately 2 miles and turn left at the stop light onto Grayson Valley Drive. Just prior to reaching Grayson Valley Drive you will pass a Gyros restaurant on your right and a car wash on your left. Follow Grayson Valley Drive for 1 mile to Fred's house. 
