Unfortunately, not much wood has been bought in past years so this arrangement has not been beneficial for us nor has it been beneficial for City Hardwoods. It was mutually agreed upon by the Board and by City Hardwoods to end the agreement.

We appreciate all City Hardwoods does for us and the Board believes it Sandra McMillan is in our members best interest to continue to use City Hardwoods! They are so nice in offering any member of the Guild a 15% discount on all wood purchases; they have a great selection of high quality wood; and they offer fantastic service and always tell you what woods would be best for your project. The Board believes this type of service is so helpful, especially to new and novice members as they teach you wood basics every time you buy from them.

> The wood has already been removed by City Hardwoods. We do have some good cherry wood that we received from an estate sale and have in storage and need to sell. Cost is \$3 per board foot. 8:00am SketchUp Workshop Topic: More SketchUp Basics

More SketchUp basics at the SketchUp workshop in February. The last workshop covered the line tool and rectangle tool along with push/pull and creating a component. For February, we will revisit these topics, answer any questions and cover using the move tool and how to copy components.

9:00am Mentoring Series: Preview and Demo of the Router Table Build Class

Pat Bush will share the design and construction features of the base Router Table which can become a cornerstone of any small shop. This is the same Router Table to be featured and built in the Class scheduled to be taught May 5 & 6 at the WEC.

10:00am February Program: Wood Dust & Chips Management

Marty will provide some basic physics to the problem as well as a systemic approach to minimizing/resolving the problem.

Marty hails from Ottawa, Ontario where he retired after 37 years from the Royal Canadian Air Force. He has been an avid woodworker all his life, designing and crafting unique one-of-a-kind furniture. An accomplished author and defining force behind Ottawa Woodworkers Association (OWA) where he is a past-President and proud recipient of their Danny Prouix Memorial Award, and a founding member of the Kinston Wood Artisans (KWA). SHOP NOTES

Bad News First:

Well much like your wood wreck (rack) at home...the project rack is a WRECK. The rack was always intended for short term project / class temporary storage. If you have items in the rack and you have not worked on the project in the last couple of weeks...please take your items home. Before anyone gets their feelings hurt...just take a look at the rack and you will agree.

Now the Good News:

New Jet Oscillating Spindle Sander is here...(please don't lose the little wrenches...and it unscrews counterclockwise),

New (replacement) Ridgid Oscillating Spindle/Belt Sander (please thank manager Dan at the Home Depot in Hoover for swapping it out...they really went well beyond the warranty for our little non-profit).

A newly donated Delta Scroll Saw (and a nice one at that) was donated by a member of my <u>church...along with a slew of blade (hundreds)</u> and some fantastic plans,


We refreshed the carbide cutters (72 of those little buggers) on the jointer and it works LIKE A DREAM. But not checking your wood CAREFULLY for metal, rocks and contaminants makes it work like a NIGHTMARE. So help us keep it running TipTop. We adjusted the bottom rollers on the planer...should help with snipe, but smaller cuts are even more effective.

And more good news...I am making plans for a new chop saw cutting station where the wood sale rack is currently. We are no longer in the wood business (vendor decided it wasn't working out - more on this to follow) - so I am going to use the wall space to create a really well thought out chop saw / router / sanding station. Envision the chop in middle, flush router on one side, sanding station with dust ports on the other - all with a dedicated high power shop vac (self contained and insulated for noise). This will also free up a good bit of much needed wall space for tools to hang on neatly. We MAY move 8 (of the 16) feet of wood rack to the wall behind the chop saw's current location for ongoing projects (this is a real maybe...).

And lastly, we have added several new supervisors to the fold over the last year or so...take a minute to thank them for giving their time to the guild. They include Henry Hager, Al Coltrane, Van Phillips, David Robinson, Randal Baylis and John Dorough. If I missed anyone, please forgive the memory loss. Nancy Reagan DID tell me to say no...but then again I was young.
