Special Interest Groups (SIGS)

The Alabama Woodworkers Guild's WEC is more than just a place to use the shop for your personal projects. It is also a place where you can learn and grow as a wood worker and as an artist and craftsman. That is why we have special interest groups (SIGs). These are weekly sessions where members can learn particular skills as well as serve the community.

The hospitals and charities we serve are now taking donations again. They have established new guidelines to keep everyone safe.

We will be very busy to get toys back in stock. We have received a large order from the American Village for 60 Brown Bess muskets! We usually send about 10 of these a couple times per year. The village pays us for the cost of wood, and they can sell them in their gift shop at a very reasonable price. However, they received a donation to purchase 60 muskets to use in their educational programs. It's a big job, but our team of merry toy makers can make it happen!

But muskets aren't the only toys we are producing. Cars, puzzles, trinket boxes, planes, pull toys are also rolling off the assembly line.
