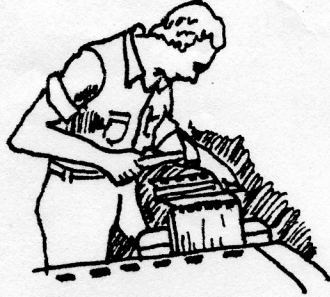


The Alabama Woodworkers Guild
